

# Staines Amateur Regatta Welfare Statement 2010



In accordance with British Rowing's Safeguarding and Protecting Children Policy, the organising committee of Staines Amateur Regatta believe that the welfare and well-being of all young people is paramount:

- All young people, regardless of age, gender, ethnicity, religion or ability, have equal rights to safety and protection.
- All suspicions, concerns and allegations of harm will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately.

The Staines Boat Club Welfare Officers have been appointed as Welfare Officers for the regatta and they will be the point of contact for any concerns or allegations. Their contact number will be posted at Regatta Control, next to the boating area, throughout the duration of the competition. Regatta Control is also the location to report Missing Persons. Any welfare concerns should initially be reported to one of the Welfare Officers.

In order to contact the adult responsible for a junior (i.e. coach or parent) it is important that the person submitting the race entry provides a usable contact number via the online entry. No individual contact details for juniors will be held.

Coaches and parents are also reminded of the need for juniors to wear clothing suitable for the conditions on the day of the regatta.

Competitors may be photographed by amateurs or professionals who sell their photographs. The regatta cannot prevent this as the regatta area and towpath are on public land that is accessible to the general public. However, the Welfare Officers will respond appropriately to any reports of inappropriate photography.
