REGATTA DATA SHEET & INSTRUCTIONS TO COMPETITORS
Ref British Rowing Rules of Racing 2-2-3.

CODE, CONDUCT & COMPETENCE	REGISTRATION & RACE CONTROL
<p>Staines Amateur Regatta and competing crews will comply with the British Rowing Rules of Racing and the British Rowing Row Safe Guide. Crews and competitors should make themselves familiar with the requirements of these.</p> <p>Local rules and particular navigation arrangements are detailed in these Instructions, the Course Map and Safety Plan specific to this Regatta. All crews must be competent and Coxswains and Steers in particular must be aware of the navigation instructions and course map.</p> <p>There must be no firm pressure rowing or practice starts in the navigation channel until beyond the start or around the boating area. Umpires may apply official warnings or disqualify crews who fail to observe this safety requirement (Ref Rules of Racing 2-2-5).</p>	<p>Crews to register no later than one hour before the first race in their event. Advise Race Control of any scratchings or any change in points that from previous wins after the close of entries.</p> <p>Race committee may re-draw any event where a competitor has scratched which results in an unbalanced and therefore unfair overall event progression. This will be done by Race Control in the presence of the Chairman of the Race Committee no later than 30 minutes before the time of the first race in that event.</p> <p>Doubling Up: where declared on entry form, at least 30 minutes has been allowed between races.</p> <p>Veteran Handicaps: will be pre-declared by the Regatta and available at Registration. Crews should make themselves aware of the handicap times for their race.</p>
FIRST AID & SAFETY PROVISIONS	RADIO NETS
<p>Safety Control, Ambulance and First Aid: St. John Ambulance based near regatta control and boating area.</p> <p>Medical & Safety Cover: From approx 30mins before the first race until the end of racing.</p> <p>Emergency Telephone: Public Phone on Wheatsheaf Lane.</p> <p>Rescue Boats: 2 fully equipped semi-ribbed launches (St. John Ambulance and Brent Lifeguards), manned with Lifesavers – no single helms.</p>	<p>Ch 1 Umpire / Safety Net: Launch Umpires / Safety Boats / Ambulance</p> <p>Ch 2 General Net: Commentary</p> <p>Ch 3 Info / Race Net: Control Commission / Start Manager / Race Control / Judges</p> <p>Chairman of Race Committee will have a radio monitoring channel 1 and channel 3.</p>
COXES AND LIGHTWEIGHTS	BOAT SAFETY CHECKS
<p>Coxes plus dead weight minimum weights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 55kg for Senior Open, Veteran Men, J18 and J16 events, ▪ 50kg for Senior or Veteran Women, WJ18 and WJ16 events, ▪ 45kg for all J15 and J14 events. <p>Coxes to provide own deadweight (if needed) which must not be worn on their person. Coxes MAY be weighed in wearing their life jacket or buoyancy aid but NOT carrying a cox box (part of boat).</p> <p>Lightweights must weigh-in (wearing racing strip) not less than one hour and not more than two hours before the scheduled start time of the first race that day of the event in which they are entered. A competitor is a Lightweight if their weight does not exceed 72.5 kg (Open), 59 kg (Women).</p> <p>Weight certificates, showing any dead weight required for coxes, shall be presented to regatta officials prior to boating.</p>	<p>Check your boat each time before you use it! You may be asked to demonstrate compliance with the British Rowing Row Safe Guide:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Bow ball is not perished or torn, is FIRMLY attached and does not deflect. ▪ Heel restraints are attached independently, sufficiently short and strong to restrain the heel below the fixed point of the shoe so as to facilitate escape in the event of a capsize. ▪ Rudder lines are functioning and in good condition. ▪ Boats designed with enclosed underseat compartments MUST have ALL hatchcovers in place. ▪ Coxes in front (bow) loading boats must wear manually inflating life jackets only. <p>In accordance with the British Rowing Rules of Racing, boats failing to comply with the requirements will be excluded from racing.</p>
BOATING & MARSHALLING	RIVER AUTHORITIES
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Report to the Control Commission pen a minimum of 30 minutes before race time. Boats must pair up with their opposition before boating. ▪ Be at the start 10 mins before your race time and attached ready to race 2 mins before your race time. ▪ Have your number pinned on your back can be seen. ▪ Inform the start manager or race control of any delays. 	<p>The Environment Agency has been notified of the event and navigation boards are erected at each end of the course advising general river traffic of the diverted navigation channel.</p> <p>From 1st October 2007 it became a requirement for all rowing boats on any part of the Thames to carry a boat ID.</p>
